The Cottage

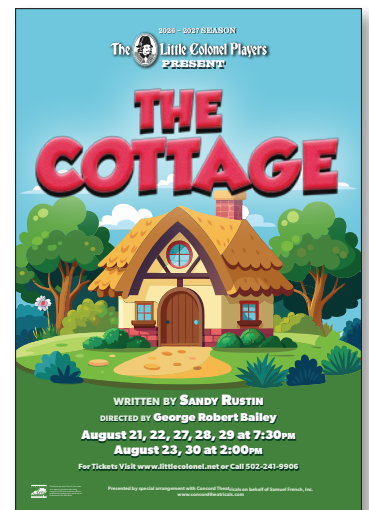

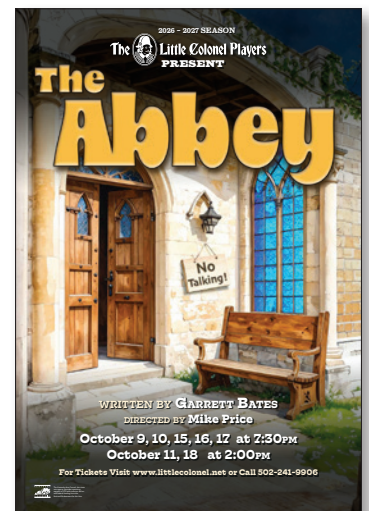
The Abbey

Miss Bennett, Christmas at Pemberley

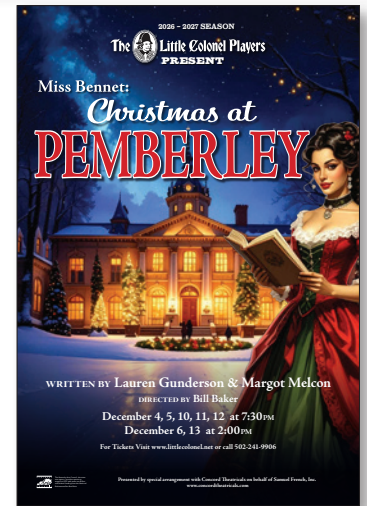

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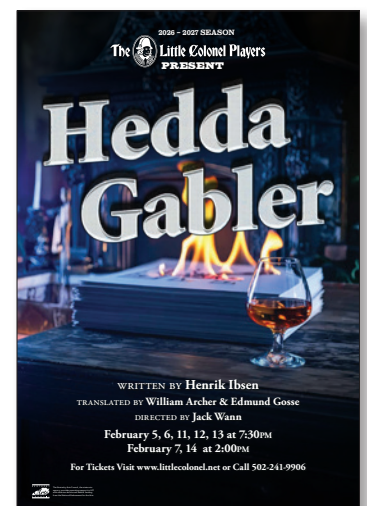
Hedda Gabler

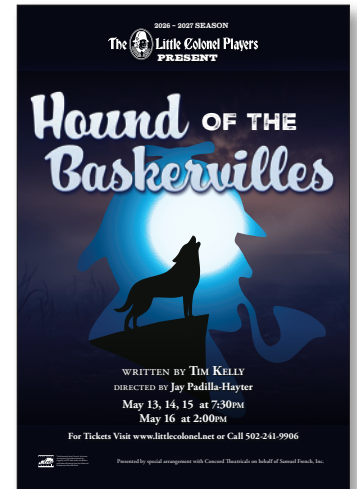

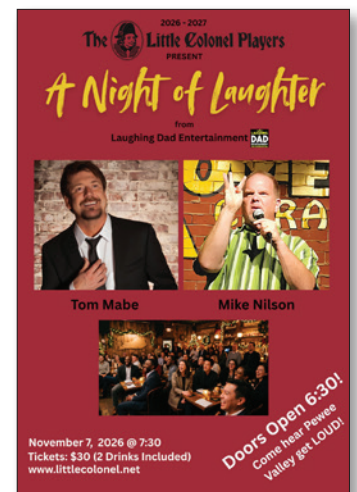
A Night of Comedy

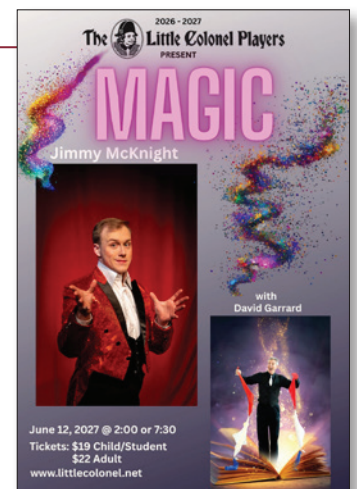
Magic Show
